- Traditional 4-year schools
 - Bachelor's Degree
 - George Mason, Virginia Tech, James Madison
- Community College or Trade schools
 - Typically 2 year program
 - o A.A. vs A.A.S
 - AA Associates Degree
 - if you want to transfer
 - 60 credits
 - AAS Associates of Applied Arts or Applied Science
 - Get you to the workforce
 - 60-69 credits
 - Certificate Program
 - 30 credits (specialization/credential)

- What is a gap year?
- USA Gap Year Fair each year in February
- Colleges & Universities with Gap year Programs
 - O Princeton University: Bridge Year program for a percentage of their incoming freshmen class each year; they fund most of this 9 months of international service work and cultural immersion.
 - Tufts University: 1+4 program
 - O Harvard University:
 - O University of North Carolina: students get \$7500 toward their gap year

Step 1: Take the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB)

Step 2: Pass the physical examination

Step 3: Meet with a military counselor and determine career field

Step 4: Take the Oath of Enlistment
