In 2023, 95 diploma candidates and 342 course candidates were assessed, representing 1310 components in 41 subject areas. Eighty-nine percent ( $89 \%$ ) of diploma candidates earned the IB Diploma. Eighty-six percent ( $86 \%$ ) of all students tested scored at least four or better (four is considered passing).

## AP EXAMS 2023

In May of 2023, 1221 students completed 2,007 tests. Sixty Percent $(60 \%)$ of the students scored at least a three or better.
