What is this class all about?

This course will focus on the significant events, people, and ideas of western and non-western civilizations from 1500 AD to the present. The concept of "identity" will be the organizing theme for this course of study. Students will study four eras of history: expansion of world populations around 1500 AD, encounters and exchanges of exploration, the age of revolutions, the World Wars and the global challenges facing the 21st century. *This course is aligned with the Virginia Department of Education Standards and will include completion of an SOL assessment*.

What is this class all about?

What is this class all about?

AP World History is a **college level** course designed to be a challenging overview that focuses on the evolution, interaction, and common threads found in human societies over time. This course is very **SKILLS** oriented to offer students an opportunity to develop their analytical abilities and critical thinking skills to understand historical and geographical context, make comparisons across cultures, use documents and other primary sources, and recognize and discuss different interpretations and historical frameworks. *This course imposes a heavy reading and writing load* that will help measure student understanding of both content and skills. Students must pass this course AND take the AP World History Exam to earn a verified credit.

- * 90-100% of material students are tested on is covered directly in class.


What should I expect in terms of homework?

- * Homework is given.
- * Homework is designed to support information covered in class.
- * Expect additional weekly assignments, projects and readings that must be completed outside of the scheduled class time.
- * About 75% of material students are tested on is covered directly in class. 25% is from work done outside the classroom.

What should I expect in terms of homework?

- * Homework is given and mostly includes readings from the AP World History textbook.
- * Students are expected to be prepared for every class.
- * Expect additional weekly assignments, project and readings that must be completed outside of scheduled class time.
- * Since this is primarily a skills-based class, only about 50% of content students are tested on is covered directly in class. 50% of the historical content students are responsible for comes from independent work done beyond the classroom.
